About this kit

Use this kit if you need to transfer money from your bank account to your prison account.

In this kit is:

- information about transferring money from your bank account to your prison account when you don't have someone to do this for you, and
- a sample letter to your bank.

You should carefully read everything in this kit. Legal Aid NSW cannot help you transfer money to your prison account. You should ask a SAPO or see a private lawyer if you have any questions.



Transferring money from your bank account to your prison account

Factsheet for prisoners

What you need to do

Step 1: Write a letter to your bank

Write to your bank and request a transfer of money. You can use the **Sample letter to your bank** and make any changes. Clearly sign and date the letter.

Step 2: Get an Inmate Request Form

You can submit an Inmate Request Form (sometimes called a 'bluey') for a bank transfer of **up to \$600.00** from your external bank account and address it to the General Manager of your prison. You can write:

I wish to transfer the sum of \$600.00 from my bank account at [the name of your Bank] to my inmate trust account via the Central Public Monies Account.

Step 3: Give the documents to the General Manager

Attach the letter to the Inmate Request Form and give them to the General Manager of your prison.

What happens next

The General Manager will review your request and make a decision.

If the General Manager agrees, the letter will be sent to your bank.

Your bank will consider your letter and check your signature. If your bank has any questions, they will contact you in writing.

This process may take some time. If you have someone you trust in the community, consider giving them Power of Attorney so they can deal with the bank for you. For more help, see the **Prisoner's Power of Attorney Kit**.
